PRINCIPAL'S ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

As St. Mary's Residential Public School, Thiruvalla is completing its forty-eight glorious years of successful and dedicated service in the field of education, I deem it a great pleasure and privilege to present before the august audience a brief report of activities of the school during the academic year 2021-2022.

Re-opening

The academic year 2021-2022 embarked on its second year of online classes on June 2nd 2021 in the wake of the persisting pandemic. Learning was facilitated through Microsoft Teams which provided the perfect platform for teachers to venture into experiential learning using varied tools of online teaching.

CBSE Board Examination Results March 2021

As you would recollect, the board exams had been cancelled last year in wake of the COVID-19 pandemic in the country. The CBSE had announced a policy for tabulation of marks for both Class X and XII.

Computation of the 5 main subjects of Class X was based on the following criteria:

20 marks based on internal assessment

80 marks based on various exams conducted in school.

The 80 marks was further divided into three sections:

10 marks for periodic / unit tests

30 marks for half-yearly / mid-term exams

40 marks for pre-board exams

Schools also had to ensure that the marks awarded by them should be in consonance with past performance of the school in class 10 board exams.

As per the CBSE, Class XII evaluation criterion was as follows:

Marks obtained in 10th, 11th and 12th in the ratio of 30:30:40 was to be computed to obtain the final result.

1. Class 10 component (30%) was based on the best 3 performing subjects in the 2019 board exam.

2. Class 11 component (30%) was based on Annual Exam 2020.

3. Class 12 component (40%) was based on unit test / mid-term / pre-board exams 2021.

The marks of Practical/Internal Assessment were on actual basis as uploaded by the school on the CBSE portal.

Based on the above criteria this year also the school recorded excellent results.

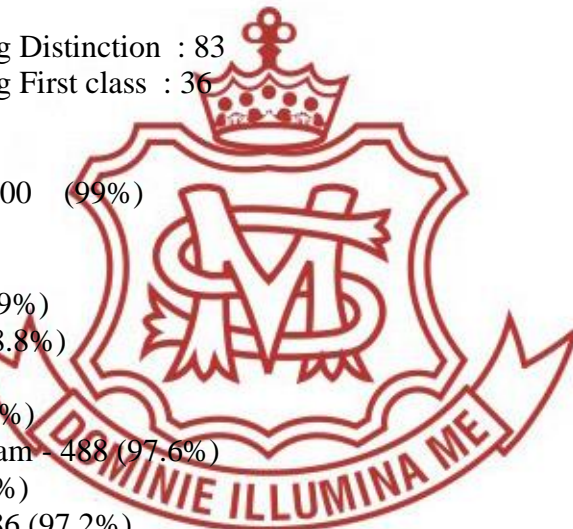

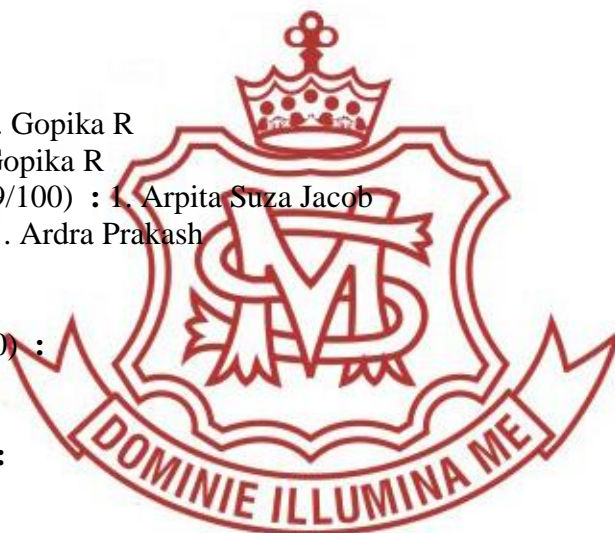

CBSE Expression Series

Children could choose from painting, drawing, paragraph writing, essay writing and poem to express their views on topics given by the Board.
